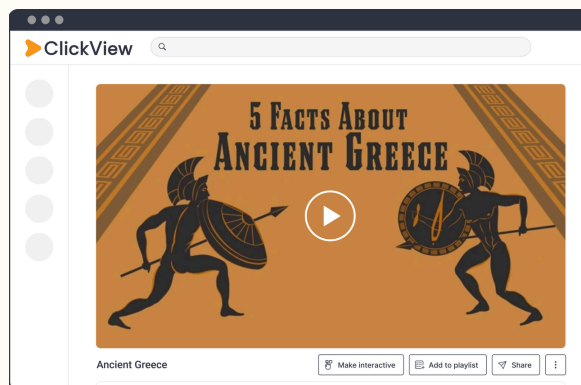

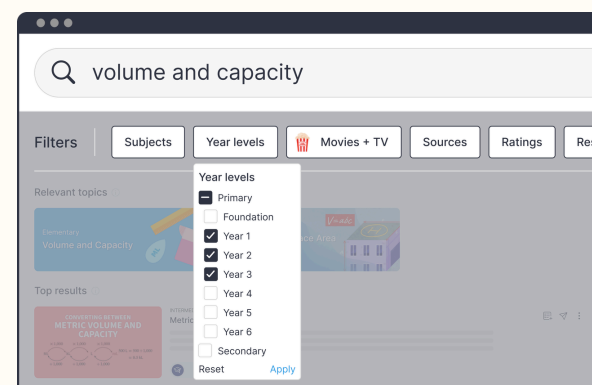

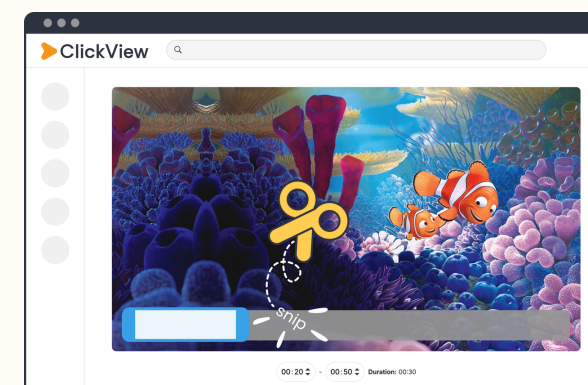
Focus attention

Engage students' attention and interest in a lesson, without the distraction of advertisements.



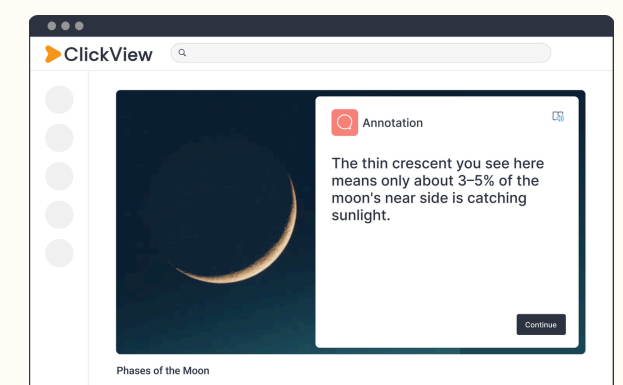
Activate prior knowledge

Access videos from previous years' curricula to revisit and build on what students already know.



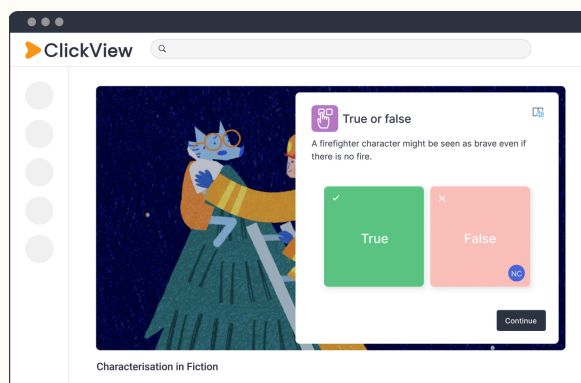
Manage cognitive load

Clip sections of longer videos to reduce extrinsic load and make every minute count.



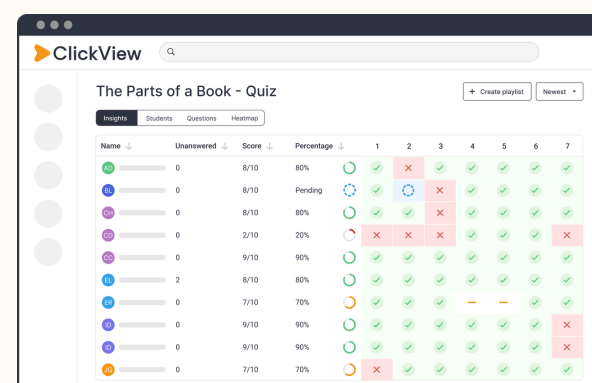
Present in small steps

Break new content into smaller chunks using Interactive videos, making new ideas easier to understand.



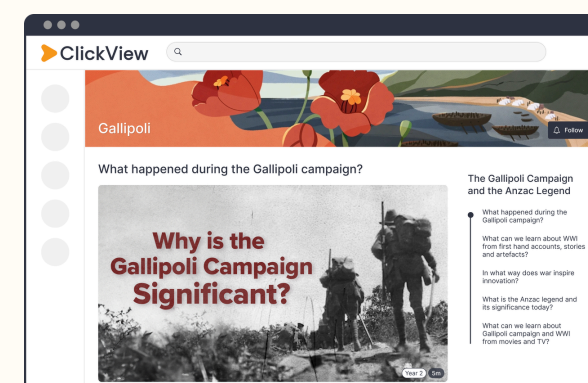
Check for understanding

Transform passive viewing into active learning: Interactive videos pause to provide opportunities to respond.



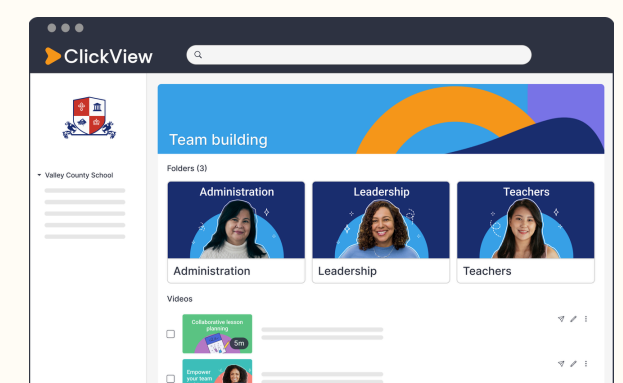
Adapt your teaching
